- I work for Stockton Libraries and Heritage Service and have recently become a Dementia Friends Champion.
- We have been very involved with our dementia services for about four years now and as a result I am part of the 'Dementia Friendly Stockton Project' working party and as such will be helping to deliver Dementia Friends sessions to our local businesses.
- We also have a volunteer deliver Dementia Friends sessions in our libraries during Dementia Awareness Week.
- We have also been delivering dementia awareness sessions to schools using story time as a focus for the last four years (the model was developed collaboratively with our dementia services and professionals). In partnership with Dementia Friendly Stockton, I am about to embark on a whole school project which will include delivering Dementia Friends sessions to the staff. I have my first appointment with a Head Teacher on Friday to put my proposal to her. If she supports this project and thinks there is real value in it I will start to approach the schools I have worked with over the last four years. If

successful the potential is to reach every child of primary school age in the borough. This will obviously take a few years to achieve and it remains to be seen how supportive schools will be, but I have high hopes. Julia Jarman has written a wonderful story book especially for raising awareness with young children. I have the proof copy and it is perfect for the work I am doing. Publication is currently due in August but will hopefully be brought forward. It would be fantastic if you could help me spread the word nearer the time.
